However, such is the lot of those who live in this great city of ours. I guess it just makes us appreciate the few warm months we have all the more.

The series on God's Appointed Times at the Chinese Baptist church continues and the response has been terrific. This past Sunday, I also had the privilege of leading musical praise and along with a couple of people from our fellowship, we introduced some new music that had people clapping and praising the Lord in a whole new way. Many came up to us after and shared how excited they were about the joy they felt during the service. This church is also in a state of transition as they are without an English pastor so it will be interesting to see how our relationship progresses but after not having spoken in a church setting for a while, it is a breath of fresh air, especially with the response being so positive.

On the outreach front, I have been reconnected to a former employee of one of my suppliers in the meat business. He is Italian Catholic and before he left, we had a couple of discussions about what having a personal relationship with Yeshua means. We're scheduled to get together Sunday afternoon and he said on the phone that I was his only spiritual connection right now. Not bad considering we haven't spoken in over 8 months so I'm excited about how God has prepared his heart.

Additionally, 2 weeks ago I visited my mother's cousin's place. Her husband is a Romanian Israeli and we had a long discussion about who Israel's Messiah was. During WWII, his mother was taken to a concentration camp and he was left with Christian caregivers who spoke to him about Jesus. He said he prayed to Jesus that his mother would be delivered and she was! Yet, today he claims he does not see the existence of God. I told him God had already shown Himself by answering his prayer 66 years ago. Please lift him up as he says he wants to believe but the enemy has blinded his heart. The ripple effect in our family would be tremendous were he ever to come to faith.

I have a need that I must share with you. During this time of transition, our income situation has been very sporadic but the Lord has been faithful. Although the Lord has been teaching us to live by faith more than ever this year, it can still be nerve-racking. Would you please lift us up for a financial breakthrough? God is faithful and provides for all of our needs according to His riches and glory but a bit of stability would be nice for a change.

Later on Ozzie stopped attending our fellowship and went with an ex-partner pastor who split with us and ventured to start another church. Last night Ozzie called me and asked me how I am doing and my family. He also said that he is trying to be sober and I told him to keep asking Jesus to help him with his struggle and look for a church where he can be a participating member because it will help him grow spiritually. I told him that we are continuing God's work and have new partners to make disciples and start churches. He said he loves us and we are always in his prayers. He is attending another church but not really a member. Another Christian still meets with him and continue to disciple him. My prayer is that God's will is to start another church in Ozzie's area in Thorncliffe Park that he can grow and also reach other people in the area. Although he is struggling with his addiction I can still see a repentant heart and openness to Jesus. He just might be a "person of peace" in that area.
